<p>Suggested timing – 5-10 minutes daily.</p> <p>Please share your child's reading book with them. Use a page in your child's homework log to record any comments when you have done this.</p> <p>These books are at your child's level. They must understand what they are reading as well being able to fluently read the book so ask them questions about what they have read too!</p> <p>Your child might want to write a review of the book they have read in their homework log.</p>		<p>Suggested timing – 5-10 minutes daily.</p> <p>Practise spelling the words on the list that have been sent out with your child every Friday.</p> <p>You child should look them up in a dictionary so they know what they mean and then write them in a sentence.</p> <p>They can read, cover and write them or speed-write them too.</p> <p>A copy of the Year 3/4 spelling list will be available to access on Showbie. You may want to choose additional spelling words from this list.</p>		<p>Suggested timing – 5-10 minutes daily.</p> <p>Use the times table books and games to help your child learn their times tables. They will have their times tables challenge on a Thursday.</p> <p>Year 4 Recall and use multiplication and division facts for multiplication tables up to 12x12.</p> <p>Enhance your Maths skills by playing Prodigy Maths at home too! www.prodigygame.com</p> 	
<p>Become a project manager!</p> <p>Create a project – make it about the Black Country. You can decide how to present it and what information you will include.</p> 	<p>Book Worms!</p> <p>Write a book review about a recently enjoyed book. Can you convince others to read it? Why not ask your teacher to display your review in your class reading area?</p> 	<p>Get Creative</p> <p>Show us your sketching skills. Can you draw a famous landmark or local place that you know e.g. a stadium, park, library.</p>	<p>Photo challenge: – Can you photograph anything that you feel is important to the Black Country? It could be places, people or food or something else!</p> <p>Print them off and add them to your homework book.</p>		
<p>Make a meal that represents the people of the Black Country. It could be traditional or multi-cultural. Write the instructions showing what you did to make it. Also, write a review for what you and your family thought of the meal so you can share it with others. Look at reviews online or in newspapers to help you.</p>	<p>Design an alternative Black Country flag.</p> <p>What colours and shapes would you choose that show the people, places and history of the Black Country?</p>	<p>Find out from your friends and relatives about their experiences of living in the Black Country. Do they have any interesting stories to tell about where they live?</p> <p>Could you retell one of these stories?</p> <p>You could write it in a book or record yourself retelling the story using your voice.</p>	<p>Use this grid to support your child by enhancing the curriculum with these extra activities too!</p> <p>You can choose which activity you wish to complete plus any other ideas that you also have!</p> <p>The best ideas that you come up with will be added to Showbie for others to try and you'll earn some dojo points for your idea, so give it a try.</p>
