#### Reminders

  - Most serious is when children dare each other to do things – particularly dares involving the A619. This is a really busy road and some children are putting themselves in danger.
  - I hear lots of complaints about children on scooters flying across the road without looking and cars having to brake suddenly to avoid them.
  - Lots of children talk about fighting when they go to the park.
- I do not want one of our children to get hit by a car or worse.
- My advice is that if they cannot be trusted to go out without fighting or putting themselves in danger then you should question whether they should be walking home or going out to play unsupervised.
- Better to ground them until they can be trusted than have them get injured.
