REINWOOD JUNIOR AND INFANT SCHOOL

Last autumn the school had a successful harvest after the summer and planted up more lettuce, broad beans and kale. For the next two terms, thanks to generous funding from One Community - the Kirklees Community Foundation, Grow to School are back to help out. Groups of children came outside to harvest, tidy, weed, dig, plant and sow vegetables, ready for the season ahead. There was bucketloads of enthusiasm as we worked through the jobs on the list. The first job was to harvest. We snipped lettuce, winter salad, chard, kale and dug up a few spring onions. These were warmly welcomed by kitchen staff.

VEGETABLE FAMILIES MOVE ROUND ONE

The vegetable families have moved round one in a clockwise direction and are now in a new growing bed for this season. They recommend rotating your crops to minimise the build up of disease in the soil and to ensure healthy crops every year.

Our featured families this month:

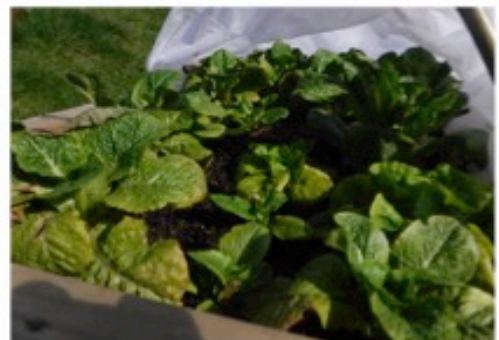
BEEF FAMILY

Chard is a colourful and easy crop to grow and we harvested rather a lot of it (see picture above). It is a member of the beet family and related to spinach. Rip it up and steam or boil or add to soups and stews. The thick stems are nice too but need a bit more cooking. The very small leaves can be eaten raw in salads. You often see it in salad bags in the shops.

POTATO FAMILY

Easter is traditionally the time to start planting potatoes. We cleared the old crops and planted our seed potatoes - an early variety called 'Rocket'.

Have a go at growing your own. You can use old supermarket spuds but it's best to buy seed potatoes - you'll more often than not get a bigger crop. All you need is a big container or bag with holes in and some compost. If you plant two spuds in a big bag this month you'll have a crop of potatoes by July.
