## FOCUS ON PUPIL POWER

Pupil Power helped in the local community this week.

Washington Rotary Club asked if we could help Washington Old Hall by planting purple crocuses outside the Old Hall in Washington Village.

The children walked to the village and planted 1000 bulbs, which will bloom in the Spring.

At Biddick, we are always very proud of our children and the Rotary Club and National Trust representatives who worked with the children praised the children for their manners, behaviour and co-operation with one another.



To end their busy week, Pupil Power led the whole school Remembrance Day assembly. They told the story of Remembrance Day and the British Legion Poppy.

Four Y6 children read poems they had written all about the poppy and Remembrance Day, which were chosen because of the high standard of their writing.

Miss Modrate sang for us and the whole school were respectful throughout the assembly. During the assembly we had two minutes of silence.

On Monday, we visited Washington Old Hall and helped to plant purple crocus bulbs. We did this with the Rotary Club for the Polio Foundation. Polio is a disease that is commonly found in Africa. The reason we planted purple crocuses was because after the children get their vaccination to stop them getting polio, they will get their 'pinkie' finger stamped in purple in to show they have had it.
