End of Key Stage 2 Swimming Report 2017 -18

96% of Year 6 pupils leaving in July 2017 are at expected end of KS 2 standard in swimming. High standard is due to CHJS supporting additional swimming sessions in year 4, 5 & 6 as well as in year 3 and having an average of 1:15 swim teacher to child ratios as well as additional support for the weakest swimmers.

Base line data of these pupils at the end of year 3 swimming sessions in July 2015 = 56% at expected KS 2 standard - many of these children are invited to join our talented swimming club to continue to develop skills to an even higher standard.
