RECEPTION This week our story has been 'The Three Little Pigs'. The children have really enjoyed listening to the story. They have shown great enthusiasm making their own story maps and have used them to retell the story. The children have also used puppets and instruments to act out the story. They also learnt a great 'Three Little Pigs' song. The children have enjoyed all their independent challenges they have done this week. They have particularly enjoyed making some great shape houses and have been able to name and count all the shapes they have used. The children have been ordering and writing numbers to 20. The children also spent time completing the new number jigsaw. The children tried hard to match the number to the correct number of objects.

YEAR 3/4 This week Snow Leopard class have continued their study of the deforestation of the rainforest and the impact that it has on the indigenous people that live there. We have started a new book called The Vanishing Rainforest which highlights the problem and what can be done to protect the rainforest and its people. We have also started to construct our rainforest dioramas using our detailed plans and they are starting to look fantastic.
