**NURSERY** What a fantastic week! We have been looking at people who help us. The police came to see us, they even took us to see their car and we got to see and hear the siren. It was so much fun. Woo, hoo, hoo!

Every day we looked at a person who helps us. We have done a doctor, a fire fighter, a police officer and even a dustbin collector.

In phonics we have been playing "What's in the box?" and had to guess what the noise was. We had to listen very carefully. If we could guess the sound on the meatball we could put it on our plate.

**YEAR 1/2** This week in Elephants class we have been looking at Posters, Labels and captions.

For Child Mental Health week we made worry boxes and produced art work based on emotions.

**RECEPTION** This week we have continued our work on the story of 'The Three Little Pigs'. The children have been very busy completing all their challenges. One of their favourite challenges was making a mask of a pig or a wolf. The children really enjoyed painting and using the collage materials to make their masks. The children also made some fantastic play dough pigs.

It has also been child mental health week and the children have been thinking about different emotions and what makes them happy and sad. We have also made some faces and talked about how the people are feeling.

**YEAR 3/4** This week Snow Leopard class have been learning about the efforts that are being made in Scotland to protect and grow the forests there to encourage indigenous, wildlife flora and fauna to return.

We are also in the second stages of crafting our dioramas so that they are ready to complete on Monday.

**YEAR 5/6** This week in Gorilla class, we've been looking at the holidays of the 1950's and 60's and how we could make them more modern and appealing for today. We created our own theme parks and produced some fantastic holiday brochures. In maths, we have worked on fractions, decimals and percentages, making sure we understand the equivalence between them.
