NURSERY We have been really busy in Nursery this week, learning our numbers to 10. Our story was Ten in a bed. YEAR 1/2

This week Elephant's class have been learning to play 'London's Burning' on our ocarinas.

In literacy we have been writing sentences using conjunctions and reading stories about feelings.

In maths we have been using different coins to find the same amounts, so do empty out those purses and wallets at home to see how good your child is with money!

RECEPTION Panda Class have been extremely busy this week. We have continued our work on Penguins and have been reading some exciting stories about them. We have been talking about our favourite parts of the stories. The children have really enjoyed painting pictures of penguins and talking about their paintings. The children have used their phonic knowledge to write labels for pictures of penguins. In maths we have been practicing counting groups of penguins accurately. We have also been learning about repeating patterns and creating our repeating patterns using the coloured penguin counters!

YEAR 3/4

This week Snow Leopards class have continued their study of The Great Kapok Tree and have been learning about the impact that deforestation has on the environment. We have written a persuasive letter to address this issue from the perspective of the animals in the story.

In ICT we have been learning to code using the program Scratch on the laptops and iPads. We have all found it to be challenging but we have learned lots of new ways of introducing movements and sounds.

YEAR 5/6

This week, Gorillas have been working really hard to produce a short narrative about rival gangs. They included some great dialogue to make the scenes full of tension.

In maths, we have been working on factors, multiples, primes and roots.

We have been looking at famous 60's dances as part of our topic - even designing our own! We are working up to writing our own 60s party invitations, describing the music, food and what to wear!
