

## Scotland's Moorland Forum Programme for Delivery 2019

The Forum provides a platform for the discussion of issues related to Scotland's moorlands. This includes more traditional moorland management practices such as farming, crofting, country sports management, such as for grouse and management of wild deer, conservation interests (both more traditional and newer agendas such as rewilding), neighbouring and related land uses and outputs such as forestry and water management, and newer interests such as renewables. Enabling such discussion remains a core function of the Forum.

The Forum has always sought to provide additional value however, in the form of defined outputs. Forum discussions in late 2018 and early 2019 indicate that members wish to focus activity into two main strands of work, these can be categorised as:

- Future Land Use and Management Policy work
- The development of good practice guidance

In addition the Chairman and Director will seek to promote the work of the Forum to government and politicians where this is appropriate, and the Director will maintain contact with a number of related fora such as: the English Uplands' Stakeholder Forum, the Scottish Wildfire Forum and the National Access Forum, and respond to consultations on issues that are relevant to the work of the Forum.
