Supporting your child at home...


Reading -Children should be reading at home at least 4 times a week. Please listen to your child read and regularly discuss their reading with them. Please sign your child's reading record and ensure that they bring their book to school every day.

Spelling - Spellings will focus on the Year 5 and 6 Spellings ready for the end of year Spelling Bee. Please discuss spelling rules with your child and encourage them to find out the meaning of a word if they are unsure.

Maths - All children need to know their times tables up to 12x12 and they should learn associated division facts using Times Tables Rockstars where

possible. Please help your child to tell the time, using both analogue and digital clocks. Please contact your child's maths teacher if your child encounters difficulties completing their homework.

Cornerstones - Cornerstones topic homework will be provided during the term. The children will be asked to complete two pieces (one art, one literacy based) and children will be provided with a set amount of weeks to complete the tasks.
