YEAR 6 CURRICULUM OVERVIEW – SUMMER TERM 2019

Children of War

<p>English</p> 	<p>In Year 6 we will be linking our writing to our topic – Children of War. We will write diaries and poems about evacuation; write instructions on building an Anderson shelter and write descriptively about The Blitz.</p>
<p>Maths</p> 	<p>In Year 6 in the summer term, we shall be recapping 2D and 3D shapes, reading and interpreting graphs, focussing on revision for SATs and problem solving strategies. We will look at creating victory gardens with links to area and perimeter and look at famous mathematicians.</p>
<p>Science</p> 	<p>In science this term, Year 6 will be learning about the light and how it travels and then move on to looking at electricity and electrical circuits after half term.</p>
<p>Computing</p> 	<p>During their computing lessons, the children will develop their knowledge and understanding of coding.</p>
<p>History</p> 	<p>In history this term, we will look at Children of War which will include: how WWII began, The Blitz, Anderson shelters, evacuation, Anne Frank, The Home Front and Propaganda.</p>
<p>Geography</p> 	<p>In geography, the children will complete various fieldwork tasks whilst at Kingswood.</p>
<p>Art</p> 	<p>In art, the children will design and create a cross stitch/stitching piece linked to propaganda.</p>
<p>D.T.</p> 	<p>The children will design and create an Anderson shelter, including furniture and an electrical circuit.</p>
<p>P.E.</p> 	<p>In the first half term, the children will undertake fencing (Premier Education) and netball. The class will learn the different passes in netball as well as footwork skills, such as pivoting. In the latter half of the term, Year 6 will practise and enhance athletic skills. Children will develop and improve their running, throwing and jumping skills in preparation for Sports Day.</p>
<p>R.E.</p> 	<p>Year 6 children will learn about the religion of Humanism. They will look at the core beliefs of Humanism along with the origin of the religion itself. Children will learn about at the Humanist Association and the typical ceremonies within Humanism. They will also compare the core beliefs with other religions of the world.</p>
<p>Music</p> 	<p>Year 6 will continue with the Charanga Music Scheme, working on the unit titled, 'You've got a Friend'. The unit features the song 'You've Got a Friend' by Carole King. Children will learn to sing, play, improvise and compose with this song. Following this unit, the children will complete a 'reflective' unit based on all the songs and types of music from the year.</p>
<p>Spanish</p> 	<p>Children will familiarise themselves with school subjects in Spanish, learning to recognise a Spanish school timetable with Spanish times, as well as being able to say their favourite subjects in Spanish. Following this, children will explore fruit and vegetables in written and spoken Spanish. They will also learn how to say whether food items are healthy or unhealthy in Spanish.</p>
