NURSERY The children have had a great first week of the Summer term. Our new children have settled well and have been made to feel welcome by all the Otter Class children. The children have started their new topic on Transport and have been talking about how they travel to different places.

RECEPTION We have had an excellent start to the Summer term. The children really enjoyed their gymnastics lesson on Tuesday morning. Please can all children bring their PE kit to school on Tuesday. We have been reading the story of the Little Red Hen. The children have done some great independent writing based on the story.

YEAR 1/2 Our new topic is Traditional Tales and we started this week with Hansel and Gretel. We are discussing and writing about our favourite characters and explaining our ideas. In maths we are rounding to the nearest 10 - and some Year 2 children can even round up to the nearest 100 and 1000! We have been very lucky to have a special visit from Mr Nicholson who works for the Council Road Safety Team. We enjoyed an extra special lesson about the 'Be Bright be Seen' campaign.

YEAR 3/4 This half term PE will be on a Tuesday and we will be learning Gymnastics so please make sure that you bring your kit every week. Year 3 will be taking part in Forest Schools on a Thursday morning so please make sure that you bring a waterproof coat and sensible shoes. Year 4s will be working on TT Rockstars during this time to work on their times table skills in preparation for the year 4 Times Table tests in June. Our new topic for this half term will be Extreme Earth, a geography based topic.

YEAR 5/6 This week, we have begun our new topic, "Manifest Destiny". The class will be learning all about how the USA became home to over 300 million people, in just over 300 years! Our class novel is about the Gold Rush in 19th Century America.
