These will be tested on the following Thursday.</p> <p>You child should look them up in a dictionary so they know what they mean and then write them in a sentence. <p>Become a project manager!</p> <p>Create your own maths game with a Roman Theme. It could include countries of the Roman Empire. Roman towns in Britain or famous Roman buildings.</p> 	<p>Book Worms!</p> <p>Write a book review about a recently enjoyed book. Can you convince others to read it? Why not ask your teacher to display your review in your class reading area?</p> 	<p>Get Creative</p> <p>Show us your artistic skills. You could sketch a Roman artefact e.g. e.g. sword, shield.</p> <p>Or why not create your own Roman mosaic showing your favourite object.</p>	<p>Take a picture: - The Roman's wore togas. With a friend or a family member, see if you can work out how to make a toga. (Take a photo of you wearing it! You could even post it on Class Dojo!)</p> <p>Write step by step instructions to explain how to put the toga on and what equipment is needed.</p>		
<p>Find a traditional Roman recipe.</p> <p>Cook your tasty Roman treat and take a photo to show your creation. Write out the recipe and evaluate what you have made. What did you think of it? What did your family think of it?</p>	<p>Research a Roman invention that is still used today. E.g. Roads, aqueduct, sewage systems, central heating (hypocaust).</p> <p>Create a fact page about your invention, or record a video of you explaining how it works.</p>	<p>The Romans loved to grow herbs for medicines. Grow a type of herb and keep a diary of its progress. You might like to use a graph, photos or observational notes.</p> <p>E.g. Rosemary</p> 	<p>Use this grid to support your child by enhancing the curriculum with these extra activities too!</p> <p>You can choose which activity you wish to complete plus any other ideas that you also have!</p> <p>The best ideas that you come up with will be added to Showbie for others to try and you'll earn some dojo points for your idea, so give it a try.</p>
