I am thrilled to see some of the children receiving their first badge for achieving four Headteacher's Awards and I look forward to seeing them wearing them with pride for their achievement. Following a successful implementation period of the new sanction system, children will lose all of their Golden time for that week from now on if they receive more than one yellow card (e.g. a second yellow card for the same behaviour in a week) or a red card as per the system.

Changes to the way we record accidents in school

From next week we are changing the way we record any accidents the children may have in school and as a result you will see a difference in the paperwork that is sent home to you. This change has been made now as we have needed to adjust our in-school recording to make it easier for managing our GDPR compliance and also to reflect the very best practice. There are three possible letters that may come home to you -

- A new EYFS (Reception only) letter
- A letter to say your child has had an accident and first aid has been administered (non-head bump)
- A letter to say your child has had a head bump and you will also be asked to sign it when collecting from school or return it to us in communication books. Your child will also have a sticker on them noting the time of incident as well to make them more identifiable within school for monitoring.
