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 <p>Seedlings – Yr 1/2</p>	<p>Introduction to our new topic: The English Civil War. To continue to look at 'conjunctions' (joining words). In Maths to look at how to do harder addition calculations moving onto division and multiplication calculations.</p>
 <p>Saplings – Yr 3/4</p>	<p>Maths – Time English – Adventure stories. Looking at work by famous children's author Dick King-Smith. Beginning our topic on Ancient Egypt.</p>
 <p>Oaks – Yr 5/6</p>	<p>SATs for Year Six begin on 13th May from Monday to Thursday. Year Six children are invited to attend a special Breakfast Club for those four days free of charge. A letter will go out separately at a later date. Year Five will undertake their optional SATs that week too. In Maths we will be busy on ratio and proportion and algebra. In Literacy we are writing instructions and diaries. We have finished our book, Private Peaceful, which most children thoroughly enjoyed. In science we are studying 'Animals including Humans'. We will look at the human body and the impact of diet, exercise, drugs and lifestyle on the way their bodies function. As part of this we will be learning about puberty. A separate letter will be sent nearer the time. As the weather is getting warmer, we will go over to the field to play rounders and cricket on Tuesday mornings.</p>
