Year 6 SATs 2019

This booklet contains some of the most important information relating to SATs week.

Please take a few minutes to read it through.

1. What if my child is ill on one of the days?

A) If your child is slightly unwell, they can leave school immediately after the test if necessary.

B) If you think your child is significantly unwell and is not going to make it into school, please let us know **AS EARLY AS POSSIBLE**.

2. What time do the tests start?

Tests will start around 9.30 a.m.

3. Where will the tests take place?

The children will sit the tests in the classroom. They will NOT be in the hall.

4. What equipment will my child need?

None. All equipment will be provided. Pupils may bring a bottle of water with them.

5. How can I help my child during SATs week?

Make sure your child has a good sleep and help them keep as calm as possible. Support them in completing their homework and the activities in the CGP study books. Try to make sure your child has breakfast—we will provide a small breakfast (free of charge) for all pupils during SATs week.

6. What if my child breaks a leg or an arm?

If your child is well enough to attend school, please send them in. We can sit them in a room where they can be comfortable and take breaks. If they have broken their writing arm, an adult can scribe for them.

7. Can my child receive help during the tests?

Reading Test: The only help the children have is with the instructions at the beginning of the test. Otherwise, no further help can be given.

Grammar and Punctuation test: If a child is unsure of the question, it can be read out to them. However, we are not allowed to explain any of the terminology.

Spelling test: No help is allowed.

Maths test: If a child is unsure of the question, it can be read out to them. However, we are not allowed to explain any of the terminology.

8. What happens after the tests finish each day?

We aim to keep the children as relaxed as possible. In the afternoon there will be short revision sessions in preparation for the tests they will be taking the following day. Please ensure PE kit is in school all week to enable us to play sports and games to unwind as and when necessary.

9. When do the results get published?

In July each pupil will receive:

- > A raw score (their actual mark for each test)
- > A scaled score for each tested subject
(100 = expected standard)
- > Confirmation of whether or not they have attained the national standard .
