Well done to our year 6 children for their hard work and super attitude as they completed their SAT's tests this week alongside every year 6 child in the country. I would also like to thank Mrs Heldreich one of our parent governors for coming into school and monitoring the administration of one of the papers and ensuring our practice is robust.

Our school councillors met today with the clerk from the Parish Council to review the plans for the new playground adjacent to school and were excited to report back to their classes. The school council have also considered what they would like to develop further in school and are busy formulating plans as to how to achieve their developments.

It has been a busy week for our governors as our Achievement and Learning committee have met to review standards and to explore achievement and progress data using our new assessment system we have in school. This is feeding into our strategic plans for the next academic year which is very exciting, more will be shared over the coming weeks and months. Myself and Kerry Hodges our Chair of Governors also attended a celebration evening for church school leaders within the Diocese hosted by the Bishop of Leicester.

Next week we are having a 'Safety Week' in school which sees the whole school taking part in a range of safety themes workshops covering sun safety, road safety and first aid. Year's 1 and 5 will be taking part in fire safety sessions led by Leicestershire Fire and Rescue. Classes 1 and 2 will take part in a special worship led by our local PSCO Kevin Bradley on stranger danger and keeping safe and then Classes 3 and 4 will take part in the 'Kid Safe Club' where the children will explore a selection of topics including being a good citizen, while developing an understanding of personal responsibility. Also raising the children's awareness of personal safety including trusted adults, safer buildings, safe strangers and the safe use of the internet and thinking about online behaviour. Classes will also be focussing on one other area of safety at some point during the week.
