In the week beginning Monday 17th June we are holding a special 'Inspirations Week' in school. We want our children to see what the future could hold for them and to get inspired by the wonderful talents of the adults and older people around them. To this end, we would like you or someone you know to consider coming into school, for a short while, to talk to a class of children about their job. We will send out a form on the first day back to start to piece together a timetable, which gives you time to have a think about whether you would like to come in...

Questions you may have-Who can come in? Any-one who has a job they would like to share with the children. Any family members, friends neighbours etc.

-Is my job deemed 'Inspirational?' We believe that ANY job is inspirational. Whatever role you have, you are a vital cog in the wheel that keeps society moving on and you never know, you sharing your thoughts with our children may just inspire one or two to think about their own future.

-What will I have to do? Just come into a class and talk about your job- How you got to where you are, what your normal day looks like, any funny or unusual stories you have etc. for about 20 minutes. No doubt, the children will then have questions to ask!

-Do I need to bring anything? No-just yourself. However, if you have any interesting artefacts /pictures/ guide dogs! the children can look at and / or touch, or costumes the children can wear etc, they would help to engage the audience!

-What do I do next? Simply gather some ideas together and fill in the form we will send out on Monday 10th June (first day back).

Let us INSPIRE our wonderful children!
