

Year 5 Curriculum Map Summer Term 2 2019

English

We will be **writing to inform** by writing non-chronological reports based on our trip to Duxford. We will also be **writing to entertain** as we write diary entries and poetry based on our WWII studies.

We will also be **continuing to practice our comprehension skills**, reading extracts from Anne Frank's *Diary of a Young Girl* and Michael Morpurgo's *Friend or Foe*.

Science

We will be continuing our learning about animal life cycles, comparing mammal, bird and reptile life cycles.

History

This half term focusses specifically on World War II, with some sessions looking at the build up to 1939. We will learn about life on the Home Front, including the Blitz, evacuation, and rationing, as well as the role of propaganda on both sides of the conflict.

Classes will be creating a joint project based on their class reading book, and will also be using their skills in designing, measuring, and cutting accurately to make models of Anderson Shelters.

READING

Each class in year 5 is reading a different book as a class. Current books are: "Kensuke's Kingdom" by Michael Morpurgo, "The Falcon's Malteaser" by Anthony Horowitz and "Carrie's War" by Nina Bawden.

Pupils also take part in daily 'guided reading' sessions, covering a range of books they may not normally choose to read for themselves.

How you can help at home.

- Read with your child regularly (we suggest at least three times a week) and sign each time in their reading record.
- Practice times tables with your child. Children should be able to recall all their tables up to 12 x 12, as well as the inverse (division calculations).
