



Primary School Sport Funding 2017-18 Strategy

What is the School Sports Funding?

The government has provided funding of £450 million over the 3 academic years 2013- 2016 to provide new and substantial primary school sport funding. The funding is jointly provided by the Department for Education, Health and Culture and Media and Sport. It will see money going directly to primary school head teachers to spend on improving the quality of sport and P.E. Each school will receive £20,000 plus an extra £10 per pupil each year.

The PE and Sports Premium is designed to help primary Schools improve the quality of Sports Provision they offer so that all pupils can develop more healthy lifestyles. The funding is ring fenced so can only be spent on provision of PE and Sport within the school.

At Loddon, our aim is to encourage as many children as possible to participate in a wide range of sporting activities. To do this we aim to provide a range of extra -curricular clubs.

2017-18 Objectives of Sports Grant Funding

- Provide staff with training and development as required to help them deliver PE lessons more effectively
- Increase the range of extra curricular clubs
- For children to develop a more healthy lifestyle by participating in clubs
- Increase the schools participation in inter school tournaments including Wokingham FA League football, Kwik Cricket and Badminton
- Purchasing specialist sporting equipment and resources to develop a fully inclusive curriculum
- Purchasing of Sports Leader equipment and uniform to promote participation in Sport and raise profile of PE

Targeted Measurable impact 2017-18

What we hope to see as a result of Sports Grant Funding:

- Staff have increased confidence in teaching PE as monitored by learning walks, pupil questionnaires and planning scrutiny.
- Increased participation in sporting clubs
- Increased participation in inter school competitions
- PE Sports Leaders trained and running Playground clubs to increase participation in Sporting Activities
- For children in Years 1-4 to work towards the end of Key Stage 2- National curriculum requirement to swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25 metres, use a range of strokes effectively and perform safe self-rescue in different water-based situations.
- School achieves School Games Mark accreditation
