Please choose from the following activities to earn at least 35 points by the end of term:

For 2 points:
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Create a poster to advertise a London musical. My favourite is The Lion King. • Research and find out a story behind one or more of the London Underground stations and write about this in your learning log. • Write your own version of 'London Bridge'. • Find out 5 facts about a London landmark of your choice. Build a model to earn 10 points extra.
For 5 points:
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Create a London landmarks crossword with at least 6 questions. Challenge your family and friends to answer them! • Make a leaflet to explain what different modes of transport can be taken in London. • Write your own poem based on the theme of cities. Why not make it acrostic? • Write a short explanation of how laws are passed in the Houses of Parliament. • Create a survey about people's favourite places to visit in London.
For 8 points
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Make a set of Top Trumps cards based on different routes on the Underground. The categories could be: number of stops, number of zones it passes through, directions of travel. • Write a diary from the point of view of a prisoner who has stayed in the Tower of London. It could be a famous king or queen. • Research about the place Greenwich and how the term GMT (Greenwich Mean Time) came to be. • Investigate the works that can be found in the National Gallery and present your findings artistically in your book. • Create your own piece of art, based on London, that could be exhibited in the National Gallery. It can be a sculpture if you like. • Use a selection of papers collected from magazines, wrappers, and scraps etc. that are water shades and create an impression of a busy London scene.
For 10 points
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Research London sightseeing tours! Create an itinerary for your family and write a letter to your parents explaining why you think it would be a good trip. Use persuasive techniques and make sure your letter is laid out properly. • Make a 3D model of a London landmark. It must include all of the key features of the landmark. You can make it any way you want to, using any materials you like - it could even be edible! • Write an adventure story based in London. Think carefully about the structure of your story - remember to use a story mountain to help you plan. • Find out about an event that takes place in London. It could be a carnival, festival or sporting event. Record your findings in any way you like, for example, a news report for television or a newsletter.
