1.	<p>Roles & Responsibilities of Children's Government</p> <p>ISSUE: not everyone will be aware of what it means to be a minister on our Children's Government</p> <p>Latest ACTION:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ministers are writing/drawing descriptions of what they do/what it means to be on Children's Government this information will be collated to distribute next year had a discussion about whether we wanted to keep the same number of ministers – yes! discussed what the main focus for each minister is/should be and how this can be more obvious and have more of an impact next year it was agreed that it might be a good idea to have a specific project for the year under each of the 5 headings e.g. Minister for the Environment – look at finding out the school's carbon footprint and then what we can do to improve it; Education Minister to work alongside Curriculum Lead in school to input on what they children learn and experience, etc. the Minister for Justice thought it would be a good idea if every half term special certificates were awarded to children who had shown particularly good behaviour.
