Maths

Count forwards and backwards to 20 and beyond.
Recognise and order numerals 1- 20.
Practice writing numeral 0-9.
Use tens frames to represent teen numbers.
Use language relating to addition and subtraction.
Begin to look at number bonds. Finding different ways of making the same number.
Books linked to maths topics:
One is a Snail, Ten is a Crab. – Representing numbers 1-20 with different arrangements of objects.



All at sea!



This term we will read stories based on the seaside, pirates, mermaids and sea creatures. The topic web shows some ideas that we may cover. A lot of our learning is based on children's interests so we may not cover all of the ideas on here but things the children come up with.

Expressive art and design

Experiment with using the different resources available. E.g. junk modelling, craft resources, paint.
Use different techniques to stick things together, attach parts and when painting.
Home corner role play.
Pirate dressing up box
Loose parts play outside.
Add different textures to paint to create seaside pictures.

Communication, language and literacy

Sing our favourite nursery rhymes and songs.
Discuss and respond to stories we read. Topic based stories this term: Rainbow Fish, The Treasure of Pirate Frank, Commotion in the Ocean, One is a Snail, Ten is a Crab
Phonics – Read write inc. program – Learn to read and write letter sounds. Continue to practice segmenting and blending sounds for reading and writing CVC and CVCC words. Read and write tricky words – I, the , no, go, to, he, she, was, my
Writing for different purposes: Writing lists for the bikes, write fact books about sea creatures, treasure maps
Story scribing – children make up their own stories that are written down and acted out by the class. Begin to be involved in the writing process by writing words and phrases.

Personal, social and emotional development

Follow the class routines.
Use the visual timetable to know what's going to happen next.
Follow rules for inside and outside.
Choose it, use it, put it away!
Sharing and turn taking.
Use and talk about our school gem powers.

Understanding the World
