This half term in Daycare and School Street Early Years the theme is 'Transport & Mini Beasts' In Daycare will be focusing on:



To support your child's learning and development progress further the partnership between Daycare and home are important. We would like to offer some suggestions of activities you could do at home with your child, this will allow your child to make the links between their learning at home and at Daycare. The theme this month is 'Transport & Mini beasts' Here are some suggestions you could do at home:

- Take a trip on a bus, train or coach.
- Create a train using chairs, cushions and boxes at home and make your own train tickets
 - Create a bug house or bug hotel for outside
 - Go on a bug hunt
- Learn maths but counting how many red cars, double decker buses and motorbikes you can see when out and about?
 - Look at photos of different types of transport.
- Download the '50 things to do before you are 5' app and work your way through the fun, low cost activities.
