Dear Parents/Carers,

This half term our PSHE topic will be Sex and Relationship education. Our teaching has been informed by the Cambridgeshire Primary Personal Development Programme which is recommended by the PSHE Association.

Below is an outline of what your child will be learning about:

In this unit your child will revisit some learning about the body and puberty. Then they will learn about sexual reproduction and the development of a baby. They will explore how their emotions might change as they enter puberty and discuss how to deal with this positively. They will consider ways they can behave responsibly and kindly when starting and ending relationships. They will think about the need for trust and love in marriage and established relationships. The children will think about all the things couples must consider before they decide to have children, and they will broaden their awareness of the different family structures in which children are brought up.
