

## Pupil Premium Allocation and Impact 2017/18.



Our school, like others around the country, receives Pupil Premium Funding for all pupils who are currently, or have in the past, been entitled to free school meals. In the 2017/18 academic year we received £26560.03 for these pupils and children in care (or adopted from care).

Within the group of children entitled to this funding there is a wide range of needs and abilities. Our aim is to match the funding to the resources needed to break down any barriers to learning and support progress from the starting points of each entitled individual.

This may include additional opportunities and experiences to build confidence and engage children in learning, additional adults to support learning and build confidence within specific subjects, particular resources to support learning within a particular subject and access to enrichment.

This year the amount was spent in the following ways:

*Staff and resources for small nurture groups*

*Staff and resources for key writing, reading, maths and grammar groups.*

*One-to-one reading with adults from the Beanstalk charity*

*Invitations to Breakfast Club*

*Places on school trips*

*Resources and equipment specific to individual needs*

*Resources to support screening for particular needs*

*One-to-one support*

*Support for emotional needs*

Larger amounts of money were spent on tutors and intervention teachers. Smaller amounts were spent on support for school trips.

In our results for KS1 and KS2 SATs this year pupil premium children performed as highlighted in the table below. The table can be used to compare the achievements of our pupil premium children with those in Kent and with the whole class average (for both KS1 and KS2).

Progress scores for KS2 children (looking at the progress they have made since Year 3 and the start of KS2) compare favourably with all children nationally.
