The Local Authority (East Riding of Yorkshire Council) has a duty to provide pupils with transport to and from their school if their school is more than three miles away from their home address.

However there are some behavioural expectations on Home to School Transport, these include

- Sit down immediately, put your seat belt on and remain in your seat for the whole journey
- Do not throw objects inside or outside the transport
- Do not eat or drink in the transport
- Use socially acceptable language
- Speak quietly and do not distract the driver
- It is an offence to smoke in confined spaces, therefore smoking on our transport is not permitted (this includes vaping)
- Do not harass, bully or abuse members of the public, other passengers or the driver in anyway (verbally and physically)
- Do not damage or interfere with the vehicle
- Respect the property of others and do not interfere with it in anyway
- Listen to and follow the instructions of the driver (and the teacher in charge when you arrive at/leave your school)
- Do not engage in any behaviour that puts others at risk

Students who participate in inappropriate behaviour on home to school transport risk being suspended for a period of time (or withdrawn indefinitely) from the provided transport. Parents are liable for ensuring any damage, caused by their child, is paid for. Should this become the case the responsibility to get students to school and home again falls to the parents. Parents cannot then use this as a reason for none school attendance and if poor attendance is a consequence parent's risk enforcement action from East Riding of Yorkshire Council's Education Welfare Service.

Students behaving inappropriately on home to school transport also risk:

- Being made the subject of an Acceptable Behaviour Contract
- Being suspended from the transport (alternative transport will not be provided, parents then become responsible)
- Being prosecuted by the Police

Should a student receive an after school detention, the school will inform the parent, the transport will not wait for the detained student. Again the parents then become responsible for collecting their child after the detention has finished. Should parents fail to collect (or arrange collection by an agreed third party) their child this will be relayed to the Transportation Services Team and transport (if this becomes an ongoing problem for the School) may be withdrawn and responsibility for transporting the child would then revert to the parents in totality.

Parents should note this agreement has been established with Transportation Services, East Riding of Yorkshire Council School's, the Principal Education Welfare Officer, the Director of Children Families and Schools and East Riding of Yorkshire Council's Legal Services.
