# Our Learning




In **Primrose Room** the children have been showing an interest in climbing. They have loved having the soft play out, climbing on it and moving in different ways.

The children in **Bluebell Room** have been enjoying using their senses to explore. Here they are playing with torches and different coloured lights.




The children in **Blackberry Room** have been learning with new resources in the communication area. They have been looking at letters and trying to match the sounds to them.
