Staggered Lunchtime Trial




This week your children may have told you that we have beem trialling a new lunchtime system. This has come about as the numbers on roll have increased significantly over the last few years and as a result the dining hall has been extremely busy. At lunchtime, it is vital that pupils are exposed to an environment where they can leisurely eat their lunch and talk to their friends quietly. Therefore, after much research and observing schools of a similar size we wanted to trial staggered lunchtimes. This system enables pupils to eat in the hall where there would be a maximum of six classes at one time. We have been so proud of the pupils this week as trialling anything new can sometimes be challenging. However, your children have been fantastic and are a credit to you all. This unstructured time of the day has been transformed this week, the children have been calm and enjoyed their lunch. We have taken pupils views into consideration and implemented this appropriately. For example, children did not want to separate packed lunches from school dinners as they wanted to sit with their friends so we have listened and responded to this. Lunchtimes will continue to be developed. We will be moving away from trays and getting plates and bowls so they really can experience a sophisticated lunch! If there are any other changes we will, of course, keep you updated. I would like to say a big thank you to all the kitchen staff and all the children for helping us trial this and congratulate everyone on helping us successfully make lunchtimes a safer, calmer and relaxed part of the day.
