2. Vision for the Primary PE and Sport Premium

3. Objective

1. To achieve **self-sustaining improvement** in the quality of PE and sport in Coldean Primary School.

4. Key Outcome Indicators

1. The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity – kick-starting healthy active lifestyles.
2. The profile of PE and sport being raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement.
3. Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport.
4. Increased attainment against objectives in the national curriculum for PE.
5. Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils.
6. Increased participation in competitive sport.
7. All pupils expected to swim confidently and know how to be safe around water by end of Key Stage 2.
