Keep your password safe. Don't post or share your private information. This includes your passwords, name, address or any other personal details.

BLOCK IT

If anybody is sending you threats or offensive messages then you need to block them. You also need to tell an adult that you know and trust so they can help you.

FLAG IT

Tell a parent or teacher if someone you don't know (a stranger) asks you for private information e.g. where you live or how old you are or even your name. Also if someone asks you to meet up with them at a certain place.

In Roblox you have to be careful about what you say and do online. Don't share information with people on that you do not know.

S - Safe - Keep safe by not giving out your personal information!

M - Meeting - Never meet someone that you have met online without a parent or carer with you!

A - Accepting - Don't accept messages, emails, pictures or files from someone you don't know!

R - Reliable - Remember that not everything you online is true!

T - Tell - Tell your parent, carer or a trusted adult if you see something that makes you feel uncomfortable.
