IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT THE ADVENTURE PLAYGROUND

Please can we politely ask that families refrain from using the equipment out of school times before 8.50am and after 3.20pm.

If the equipment is not supervised by a member of staff, or if it is used out of school times families will not be covered on the school's insurance.

Please note that if parents/carers choose to let children use the equipment outside of school hours then they should be fully supervised at all times, and should an incident occur during this time, it becomes the responsibility of the parents/carers and not school.

PLAYGROUND MARKINGS

We have obtained some quotes for new playground markings. In the meantime, we have identified that some areas of the playground require re-surfacing so we will be looking at resurfacing work to take place prior to the playground markings.

NEW GATES!

You may have noticed that we have had some new gates fitted to the main entrance to school. This is to enhance our existing security and safeguarding measures. The work is almost complete and from Monday next week they will be fully operational. Both the pedestrian and drive gates are now electrically operated gates.

They will be programmed to be open at key times of the day i.e. arrival and collection times. At other times they will be closed/locked and anyone arriving at school will need to press the buzzer. Staff in school will then be able to see via security cameras who is wanting to access school and will facilitate the opening of the gates. Please bear with us as we get used to our new system ©

VOLUNTARY CONTRIBUTION TO SCHOOLS MAINTENANCE FUND

In the past, Catholic Schools have asked for a voluntary contribution from parents/carers to the Schools Maintenance Fund. The Maintenance Fund was established by Bishop John to support Voluntary Aided Catholic Schools in meeting their 10% share towards capital projects (for any repairs and improvements to the external fabric of the school building).

As an Academy, we are funded differently for our capital projects. Funding for capital projects is now secured by bidding in to the EFA (Education Funding Agency) like all other academies whether they are Catholic or not. However, it is becoming increasingly difficult to secure this funding as it relies on meeting criteria that states the school needs to expand or the condition is so poor there are health and safety concerns. Therefore, this means it is more important than ever that we maintain our schools on an ongoing basis yet with ever reducing budgets this is proving more and more difficult to do.

As a result, many schools, including those in Our Lady Umbrella Trust, are continuing to ask parents to make a voluntary contribution to a School Maintenance Fund. This fund will be used to enable small projects such as painting, decorating, window cleaning, refurbishment and minor repair works to be undertaken to ensure that our school environment is as safe, welcoming and attractive as possible.

The governors wish to make it clear to parents that there is no obligation to make any contribution and children of parents who do not contribute will not be treated any differently.

The amount being requested towards this fund is £10 per child (This works out at 20p per child per week) or £15 per family or whatever voluntary contribution you are willing / able to make. Payments can be made by cheque (St Thomas More Catholic Primary) or cash.

Y5 VISIT TO RIPON POLICE AND PRISON MUSEUM

FRIDAY 29TH NOVEMBER 2019

To consolidate and further our learning of our Crime and Punishment topic this autumn, Year 5 will be visiting the Ripon Police and Prison Museum on Friday 29th November. Sit in a prison cell, hear the door slam shut and imagine the harsh conditions of Victorian prison regimes. Try on prison uniforms, imagine the horror of being set in the pillory, strapped in a restraint chair or hung in chains. Turn the crank, carry out shot drill or work the treadmill. They'll discover the history of policing in Yorkshire, from the Anglo-Saxons to the formation of professional policing. Police uniform, insignia and transport are all displayed, with the chance to sit on an original police motorcycle! The total cost of this trip is £21.00.

We will be leaving school at 08:45 so children will need to be in class to be registered by 08:35.

Children must come in their school uniform with a packed lunch. As it will be late November, please ensure your child is dressed for the weather as we will be outside for some parts of the visit.
