At North Ferriby CE Primary School, we keep Christian values at the heart of our school community where we live, love and learn together.

YORK DIOCESAN BOARD OF EDUCATION

The school's current admission arrangements adhere to the criteria set by the East riding of Yorkshire Local Authority. The present admission limit is set at 40 children. Children are admitted to the EYFS class at the beginning of the school year in which they will have their fifth birthday. The school year runs from 1<sup>st</sup> September to 31<sup>st</sup> August.

Our school ensures equal opportunities to all pupils. Pupils with special educational needs and/or physical disabilities have the same admission arrangements as all other pupils. Our school has many adaptations to allow wheelchair access. If further equipment or changes were required then the school would aim to fulfil the need.

Parents can apply for places at schools online using an electronic application form available on the Council's website ([www.eastriding.gov.uk](http://www.eastriding.gov.uk)) or by completing the paper application form which will be sent to your home address. The Council's Admissions Team will then process the applications and will send out the allocation letters to parents.

### **Visiting Arrangements:**

Prospective parents are encouraged to visit the school and are asked to contact the school office in order to arrange a mutually convenient time.

The school holds an open day every November for prospective parents. Those attending are given a full tour of the school and its grounds and the children are able to take part in an activity organised by our EYFS team.

A further event for parents of pupils who have been given a school place is held in the summer term. This is an evening event for parents and carers to pass on key information about the school and about their child's first few days at school in the following September. This is then followed up by two 'experience' mornings for the children to give them an idea of how their days will be when they join us full time in September.
