

## Class 3 Homework-Autumn Term 2019



### Topic - Rock of Ages

Welcome back to the new school year and for some of you to juniors! I am looking forward to seeing all of the homework that your children complete, as I know it will be amazing! Children will be rewarded with house points for any completed homework that is handed in.

To help children learn how to spell different words and build up their vocabulary, spellings will be given out on a Friday and will be tested the following Friday. Spellings will either focus on a spelling rule or common exception words and will be tested through the use of cloze text.

The homework has been designed to allow a degree of flexibility. All children have access to school resources and books about the topic. Some of the homework options will take longer to complete. We appreciate how busy lives can be and how hard the children work in school, so please view the topic homework as an opportunity to enjoy a project! Do not feel you need to complete a task every week; you can choose between reading, maths or the topic work, depending on your child's needs.

Children will be provided with a homework book to record homework. If it is a more practical task, or it is better to complete on paper, that is also fine. If work is on paper, it may be added into their topic folder at the end of the term. Please ask your child to place completed work into the Homework Box in the classroom on a Monday. Thanks.

### **Writing**

Write a recount - A day in the life of a caveman/woman.

Create an acrostic poem for either the Stone, Bronze or Iron Age

Dress up as a person from the Stone, Bronze or Iron age and take a photograph. Write an autobiography or diary.

Research Mary Anning, the famous fossil hunter and present your findings.

## **Knowledge and Understanding**

Create a PowerPoint/Fact File about the Stone, Bronze and Iron Age

Create a timeline with some key facts about the Stone, Bronze and Iron Age.

Create a Horrible Histories style comic/cartoon.

Draw a map of the UK and show where Stone Age people lived.

## **Art and Design**

Make a typical Stone, Bronze or Iron Age house.

Make an artefact such as a bowl, a weapon or a tool.

Make your own fossil from modelling material.

Make a Bronze Age brooch.

## **Maths**

Using 2D/3D shapes, make a replica of a Stone Age village or an Iron Age hill fort.

Make a tally chart. Find five interesting facts about the Stone, Bronze and Iron Age. Ask your friends and family which fact they find the most interesting. Make a tally of their responses.

Research Stonehenge. Draw a diagram and record the measurements.

Research board games about the Stone, Bronze and Iron Age and make one of your own.
