Background to the Primary PE and Sports Premium

PE & Sport Premium is funding provided to primary schools, in addition to main school funding. This funding is ring-fenced and therefore, can only be spent on the provision of PE and sport in schools.

Objectives for PE and Sport Premium

- To improve the provision of PE at St John the Evangelist CE Primary School; ensuring all pupils get two hours of quality PE teaching per week
- Broaden the sporting opportunities available to pupils outside of the school day
- To develop an enthusiasm for sport by children and staff

Decisions on how to spend the premium and ensuring improvements are sustainable

The governing body and leadership team recognise the value of PE and school sport on promoting healthy lifestyles and the benefits to pupil's wider achievement in school. They are committed to sustaining the levels of provision that have been developed over the last four years. This will be achieved with the commitment to employing a specialist sports coach to work with children across the school before, during and after the school day and to support the CPD of teachers so that they remain up-skilled at all times. The school look at PE and sport as part of the wider approach to well-being and how we educate children to make healthy choices which should support them into adulthood.
