Fire Safety Checklist



- Do you have smoke alarms that work?

Smoke alarms sound if there is a fire in your house and give you extra time to get to safety. Check yours are working once every month!



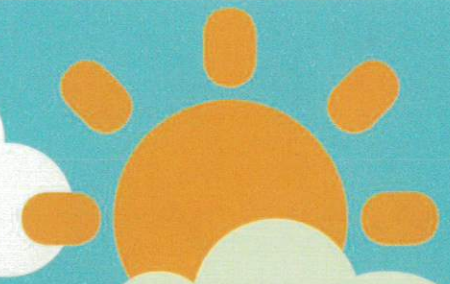
Did you know?

Keeping fire hazards out of reach of children reduces the chance of an accidental fire being started.

As a family, plan what to do if your smoke alarm sounds or if you discover a fire. Remember to alert everyone by shouting 'FIRE', then exit by the safest route.

When you are out, do your parents know where you are going and what time you will be home?

Is care taken when there are boiling kettles, hot drinks, cigarettes or hot irons around?
