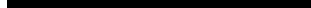


**St Cuthbert's Catholic Primary school: Primary Sport Premium
fund statement 2018/19**



Sports Premium. September 2018-July 2019.

During this period the school has received **£ 17,800** to improve the quality of sport and PE provision at St Cuthbert's Catholic Primary School. Our vision still remains to create a culture that encourages all our children to be active and have positive attitudes towards physical activity and healthy lifestyles.

General equipment order for Beginning of the school year i.e. extra balls, bat and ball games for the playground and other miscellaneous – From Yorkshire Catalogue	£ 392.48	The playground equipment box and PE storage cupboard are fully stocked enabling teachers to plan lessons without worry of having enough equipment and allows children the chance to play at break and lunchtimes.
Large Trike single for reception class.- TTS	£ 159.95	Replacing old equipment from EYFS which no longer is suitable for use.
Lawn mower for field- Trade UK	£358.08	Will enable us to mow the school playing field and more regular basis meaning it can be used for more of the year.
Balance bench- Mercury	£602.10	Old equipment no longer suitable for use is replaced.
Sports Stickers for Sports day- Superstick	£29.04	Children feel motivated to participate in sports day, as well as all felling included.

Basketball: 31 children KS2 attended Basketball clubs. Gross Motor: Reception class was able to have targeted PE lessons all year round.</p>
<p>JDC: Dance club 1x a week (Year 1,2 + 3)</p>	<p>£540.00</p>	<p>Dance club attendance throughout the year: 25 Children. The club put on a termly performance for parents. Around 15 of the children participated the whole year round.</p>
<p>Central Partnership Sports Programme:</p>	<p>£4100.00</p>	<p>Participating within the partnership scheme has meant that staff have received extra CPD this year, which has upskilled them in teaching PE. Classes Year1, Year 2, Year 3, Year 4, and Year 6 have all participated in a sports festival day, by which children have tried new sports and competed against other schools. This programme has also enabled us to hold CPD training opportunities for our dinner supervisors, so that they are more confident in delivering fun and engaging activities. Year 5 & 6 children were given the opportunity to participate in a Play Leader scheme which means 12 children receive a day's training alongside a member of staff which enables them to deliver activities to their peers at lunchtimes. This has seen an increase in activities such as football skills, dodgeball and skipping challenges at</p>

		breakfast club, breaktimes and lunchtimes from EYFS all the way to the top of KS2.
Payments towards residential trips- Condover hall (JCA)	£2723.00- schools contribution.	This is the Year 6 residential trip for 3 days and 2 nights. 30 children attended and participated in new activities such as: Kayaking, rock climbing. Orienteering, buggy building, low rope obstacle courses and other team work activities. This price included accommodation and food.
Extra non-curriculum swimming sessions term 3.- Birmingham city Council	£979.00	The aim of this term's session was to give extra swimming lessons to children from KS1 and KS2 who have gross motor difficulties or a special educational need. In total 15 children attended. This enabled them to have lessons in smaller groups, some with adults in the pool assisting them.
Transport	Cost	Impact
Transport to sporting event for partnership programme- MJGros	£145.00	As a school without its own minibus, this enabled us to take our children to a sporting event provided by our central partnership programme.
Transport for swimming all year- Claribel.	£632.45	Children were safely driven to and from swimming all year. This was all classes from KS2 and then additional classes in third term for children from KS1 and KS2
Residential trip transports- Endeavour	£802.00	This expenditure meant Year 6 were dropped off and collected from their residential. Whilst driving too Condover Hall the coach would stop off at Carding Mill Valley and the children would go on a hike with their class teachers.
Total	£15,388.10	Any remaining budget from this year or the previous academic year is being carried forward

		in order to help pay for the resurfacing our school playground.
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Other sporting activities which were free of charge:

- Netball club ran by school member of staff: 18 participants from Years 5 & 6.
- Chance to shine Cricket (Warwickshire County Cricket Board) Year 4 and 5- 1 hour coaching for 6 weeks followed by a participation in a cricket festival at Marlborough Cricket Club Yardley.
- Aston Villa- Premier League Stars- 10 weeks- Autumn Term- Includes class time phonics activities for KS1, lunchtime coaching activity (30min), Y1 and Y3 pm PE session and after school club football clubs aimed at boosting participation for girls (around 15 girls attended this club)

Swimming Team	Athletics Team	Football Team: 5, 7 and 9 a side teams plus friendly matches.
8 pupils from Year 5 and Year 6. 3 Children made their final after competing in their initial heat.	14 Pupils mixed from Year 3-Year 6 made up the athletics team. As a school we won the Year 3 girls sprint, Year 6 Girls sprint and boys 800 M. Our Year 6 girl sprint winner has won it every year since she was in year 3, a record for Birmingham catholic schools.	16 Boys took part in games for the football team this year as well as 6 girls.
