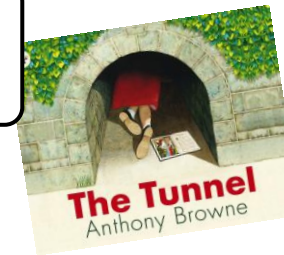
- Comparing grouping materials together, according to whether they are solids, liquids or gases.
