<p><u>English</u> _Write some sentences to describe your weekend activities. Remember to use capital letters, full stops and finger spaces.</p>	<p><u>English</u> Can you write a description of your favourite storybook character using lots of describing words? Encourage your child to write about what the character looks like, sounds like, acts like and what they like to do, etc.</p>	<p><u>Creative</u> Create a personal collage about yourself Children could use magazines and newspapers to create the collage.</p>
<p><u>Physical Development</u> Can you practise throwing and catching balls of different sizes? Could you turn it into a game? Your child could count how many times they can catch the ball and then see if they can beat that score with the next ball.</p>	<p><u>Art</u> Sketch your own portrait. You could use a photo or mirror to help you.</p>	<p><u>Maths</u> Can you practise adding 2 numbers together using objects to help you to work out the answer? Your child could use any objects from around the house or even something outdoors! Try to make it as fun as possible.</p>
<p><u>Computing</u> Research your name - What does it mean? Are there any famous people or buildings that share your name? Please ask an adult before using a computer.</p>	<p><u>Maths</u> Create a number bonds game to help you learn your number bonds to 10. Number bonds example 2+8, 7+3, 9+1, 5+5</p>	<p><u>Maths</u> Can you go on a shape hunt in your home or garden? Your child could take photos of them or draw them in their book.</p>
