

During Term 1 we will be learning to:

Use dominant beginning and end sounds for all words. We will also be learning how to say out aloud what we are going to be writing about and to sequence sentences to form short narratives (stories).



Learn about the lives of significant individuals in the past who have contributed to national and international achievements (Neil Armstrong).



Apply our developing Math skills to real life activities, for example recognising coins– 1p, 2p, 5p, 10p, 20p, 50p, £1 and £2. We will also be learning to read and write our numbers to 30 confidently as well as learning how to read our numbers to 100.



Understand what algorithms are (instructions); how they are implemented as programs on digital devices; and that programs execute by following precise and unambiguous instructions, using Beebots.



Use materials creatively to make products, such as planets or a rocket.



Identify and name a variety of everyday materials, including wood, plastic, glass, metal, water, and rock.
