


Its capital is Cairo. It also situated on the River Nile.</li> <li><input type="checkbox"/> The ancient Egyptians used hieroglyphs to record and communicate information about religion and government.</li> </ul> <p>In Egypt, the River Nile creates a fertile green valley across the desert. It was by the banks of the river that one of the oldest civilizations in the world began. The ancient Egyptians lived and farmed along the Nile, using the soil to produce food for themselves and their animals</p>		
Tomb	A large vault, typically an underground one, for burying the dead			<p><b>Important</b></p> <p>Tutankhamen took the throne at the age of 9 or 10 in 1333 BC. He died in 1323 BC, possibly due to a broken leg or malaria.</p> <p>The ancient Egyptians built pyramids as tombs for the pharaohs and their queens. The pharaohs were buried in pyramids of many different shapes and sizes from before the beginning of the Old Kingdom to the end of the Middle Kingdom</p>
