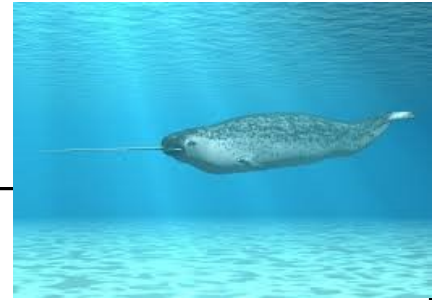

Please share Bug Club books with your child on a regular basis. Children will be allocated 6 books per term and are expected to read one per school week. Please write in when you hear your child read. Children may write a sentence or draw a picture out of the book. Year 2 children are encouraged to take an active part in their reading diaries. It is important that children read regularly at home. Class library books may be brought home as well.

Every Thursday from 3:15—3.45 we invite you and your child to select books from the Oxford Reading Tree library, outside the Year 1 area, to read at home.

Homework – suggestions for activities to support sounds and maths work covered in class are put onto the class page of KLZ . In particular, 2, 5 and 10 times table recall or working on telling the time to 15 minutes, would support your child's learning.

Please see the class teacher if you have difficulty logging onto KLZ.

Outdoor PE will take place on Tuesday afternoons and indoor PE on Wednesday afternoons. Please ensure that your child has the correct PE kit for PE days and that they are not wearing earrings or can remove them themselves. You may wish to give your child something to keep them in.
