SAFETY IN SCHOOL

Can I please remind parents about the importance of keeping your children safe in and around the front entrance of the school. We do have signs up in our car park asking parents not to cut through the car park, but we continue to see parents doing so every single day. Cars come and go in the car park throughout the day. If a car were to reverse, the driver simply would not see our smallest children in their mirrors—believe it or not, we actually see children running ahead of their parents making them extremely vulnerable. Also, we see parents letting their children walk across the front driveway where our staff cars enter and exit every day. Their little lives are far too precious to be risking such unsafe behaviours. Please keep to the paths provided. I know you would not let them run behind cars that were in a public car parks like Tesco or Morrison's, so please adopt the same approach in our car park too.

WATER BOTTLES

We encourage all of our children to bring a water bottle, filled with fresh water, to school every day. Being hydrated helps their brains function better. If your child refuses to drink water (even though we strongly encourage you to change this) please speak to their class teacher. Many thanks

As the adults in their lives, we need to model that for them and teach them how to behave responsibly online.
