




Y3 Homework Terms 1 & 2 – Step into the Stone Age



How many activities can you complete?

Writing Activities

- Write a diary entry about a day in the life of a boy or girl living in the Stone Age. Where do they live? Who do they live with? What do they do?
- Write a story based in the Stone Age. Design a front and back cover for your story. Write the blurb on the back.
- Write your own recipe for a Stone Age dinner using the sort of ingredients that would be available.
- Write a list of questions you would like to ask a Stone Age person.
- Be a reporter. Interview a member of your family about what they know about the Stone Age. How could you present what you find out?

Maths Activities

- Stone Age people did not use numbers as we do. Can you come up with your own method of counting? You might want to choose symbols to mean certain amounts.
- Practise partitioning 3-digit numbers into 100s, 10s and 1s. How many different ways can you partition the number? *E.g.* $345 = 200 + 140 + 5$
- Choose a 3-digit number. Practise finding 10 and 100 more or less than that number. *E.g.* 10 more than 359 is 369. 100 less than 678 is 578.
- Make up your own addition and subtraction word problems for a friend or family member to solve. Can you show them the different ways we have learnt to add and subtract numbers?

Making Activities

- Create your own cave painting to show people in the future what it is like to live in 2018. Look at Stone Age cave paintings for inspiration.
- Stone Age people built shelters using materials they had gathered. Gather some natural materials like leaves or twigs and build your own model shelter.
- Design and make an ancient stone circle or a replica of Stonehenge. Be creative in the way you make your stone circle.
- The wheel was invented during the Stone Age. What is a wheel used for? Build something that uses a wheel/wheels.

Finding Out Activities

- Find out about the different tools and weapons used by Stone Age people. Think about how you could present what you have found out.
- Make up a quiz with facts about the Stone Age. Make sure you also have the answers!
- Explore what the South West has to offer about the Stone Age e.g. Stonehenge, MShed, Bristol Museum

Weekly Activities

- **Spellings:** Practise your spellings on Spelling Shed.
- **Reading:** Read your book for at least 10 minutes and record this in your Reading Record. We will be celebrating children who read at least 5 times a week!
- **Times Tables:** Play 10 minutes of Times Table Rockstars or chose another way to practise your times tables.
- **Homework:** Choose one activity each week from the tasks above, or think of your own homework task linked to our topic.
