Pupil Premium Grant and Expenditure Report

What is the Pupil Premium?

Pupil Premium is additional funding which is allocated to schools on the basis of the number of pupils have been eligible for free school meals (FSM) at any point in the last six years or have been looked after continuously for a more than six months. The purpose of the funding is to address inequalities to give all pupils the best possible chance of success. For the Year 2018 -19, the school received £ in pupil premium funding.

Barriers to Learning

Just like all children, disadvantaged children are of all levels of ability. However, they do not always have access to some of the resources and opportunities available to others and this can have an impact on learning, attainment and progress. To redress this, we offer extra support programmes.

The Support We Offer

The Governing Body, in partnership with the Head teacher, have decided that this grant should be allocated for use as follows: -

- Additional one to one or small group tuition programmes for disadvantaged children who need a boost to their learning in order to reach their potential; for example, small group reading, writing or maths tuition.
- To support children's learning in the classroom by effective use of additional adults ensuring that the disadvantaged children have their needs clearly identified and their progress closely monitored.
- Enrichment programmes to support the wider educational needs of those children attracting the pupil premium, such as helping to fund their school trips and attendance at extended school activities.
- We support families by offering a free school uniform every academic year.
- We provide free milk for those children who apply.

Disadvantaged children in Year 4 and and 5 attainment was in line with or better than all children. Attainment in Year 6 is stronger than the national expectation. It was not as strong in lower year groups but the proportions of disadvantaged children in each of these classes was very small which had the effect of creating top heavy data.
