Hunter	Person who hunts game or wild animals for food	<input type="checkbox"/> During the Iron age, iron replaced bronze as the main metal for making tools and weapons. Better tools for agriculture improved farming, leading to a rise in populations.			
Gatherer	Someone who collects or gathers a particular thing	<input type="checkbox"/> Farming meant that people did not have to move to new places to find food and led to the end of hunting and gathering.	Stonehenge is a famous stone age monument in Wiltshire. It consists of a ring of standing stones with each standing stone around four metres high.		
Weapons	Any instrument or device for use in attack or defence	<input type="checkbox"/> In the Neolithic era, communities (like Skara Brae) were able to domesticate animals and grow their own crops.
