Our learning in school this week.

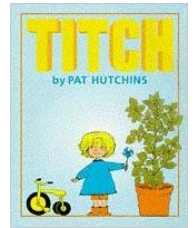
In phonics this week we have learnt the sounds **i, n, p, o and g**. We are all gaining confidence in our letter formation and have started to blend the sounds together to help us to read.

In literacy we have been reading the book *Titch*, a story all about a boy and his big brother and sister. We have then created our own books about ourselves and our families.

In maths we have been practising our number recognition and ordering numbers. We went on a number hunt around school to see if we could recognise numbers in the environment.

In topic we have been looking at what makes us unique. We discussed similarities and difference between ourselves and others. We also wrote about our own special talents. We enjoyed having a visit from a mother and baby.
