A major tool in Luke's Gospel is 'reversal'. We see a clear example of this in today's parable. The lives of these two men are radically different; the rich man wears purple robes, the most expensive colour dye at that time, and he feasts every day. A gate separates these two men; the rich man is far above Lazarus in terms of status and wealth. The rich man does not even see Lazarus.

Yet notice how the rich man is not given a name. This is significant as names were important for people who were considered to be of high status; it gave them recognition yet it is the poor outcast beggar who is named....a name which means 'God helps'.

When they die, their situations are completely reversed. The rich man in the afterlife wants Lazarus sent to his brothers, but it is not proof or special signs that they need. Their vision has been blinded by wealth.
