If your child has an appointment during school time, could you please let the school office know the day before if possible or on the morning of the appointment. Thank you.

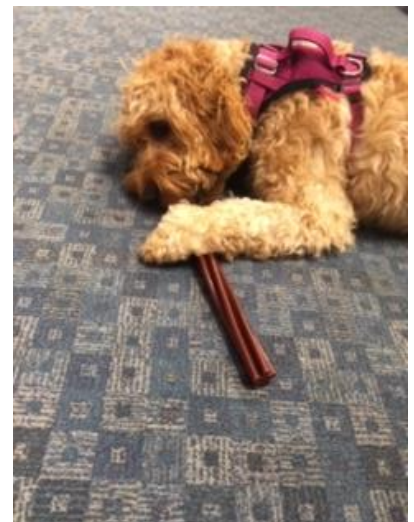
Tilly's Diary – Happy Birthday Tilly!

Primary Teacher Training

Truro and Penwith Academy Trust work in partnership with Cornwall Teaching School to deliver primary teacher training in all 28 of our TPAT schools across Cornwall. The teacher training programme follows the School Direct (tuition fee) route, offering a wealth of hands-on experience with successful completion leading to a Qualified Teacher Status (QTS) whilst completing a PGCE.

Upcoming Information Sessions

20th November 2019 **ROCHE PRIMARY SCHOOL** 2.00pm – 3.00pm

Key Details

The sessions will include information on requirements about gaining a place on the PGCE, and signposting to courses and experiences required for application. There will also be information on the application process itself. There are many different ways to reach your goals and we are here to help.

Three quarters of the initial teacher training year is spent in our school with the remaining 25% of the time spent on centre based training with our training partners, the Ofsted Outstanding Cornwall SCITT.

The School Direct (tuition fee) route means that trainees can learn on the job, whilst working towards Qualified Teacher Status. There is a close relationship with the placement schools.

Trainees can choose to specialise in Early Years and Key Stage 1 (ages 3-7) or train in general primary (ages 5-11). Both routes will qualify trainees to teach right across the primary age range – the choice of route will guide which age classes trainees are placed in.
