

Foundation

In Foundation we have been learning about Harvest. We have talked about what the word harvest means and how many of the things we eat are harvested. We have also talked about how some people celebrate harvest festival and discussed that it is often a time to be thankful for the things we have. Inspired by harvest time we have been reading the story of 'The Gigantic Turnip,' and the children have been busy acting out and retelling the story. At the end of the tale the characters enjoy turnip stew, so we have worked together to make our own turnip stew to try.



Class 1 & 2

In history, Key Stage 1 have continued to learn about the computer programmer Ada Lovelace. In fact we discovered that October the 8th was Ada Lovelace day! We have been finding out about algorithms and how to use them to give instructions to each other and then to a robot.

We wrote our algorithms down and tested them by seeing if another person could follow them to the same destination. We are now learning how to program a bee-bot to follow an algorithm along a route.

On No Pens Day we were finding lots of ways to describe the pumpkins we have been reading and writing about in English. We used our senses to describe the look, feel, smell and taste of raw and cooked pumpkins.



Class 3

In class 3 we have based our learning around the story 'We're Going on a Bear Hunt'. We experienced different textures to represent the parts in the story. We re-enacted the story with a sensory walk and children also collaged their own bear masks.

We also went on a walk to look for signs of Autumn and collected leaves. We then used the leaves for printing.
